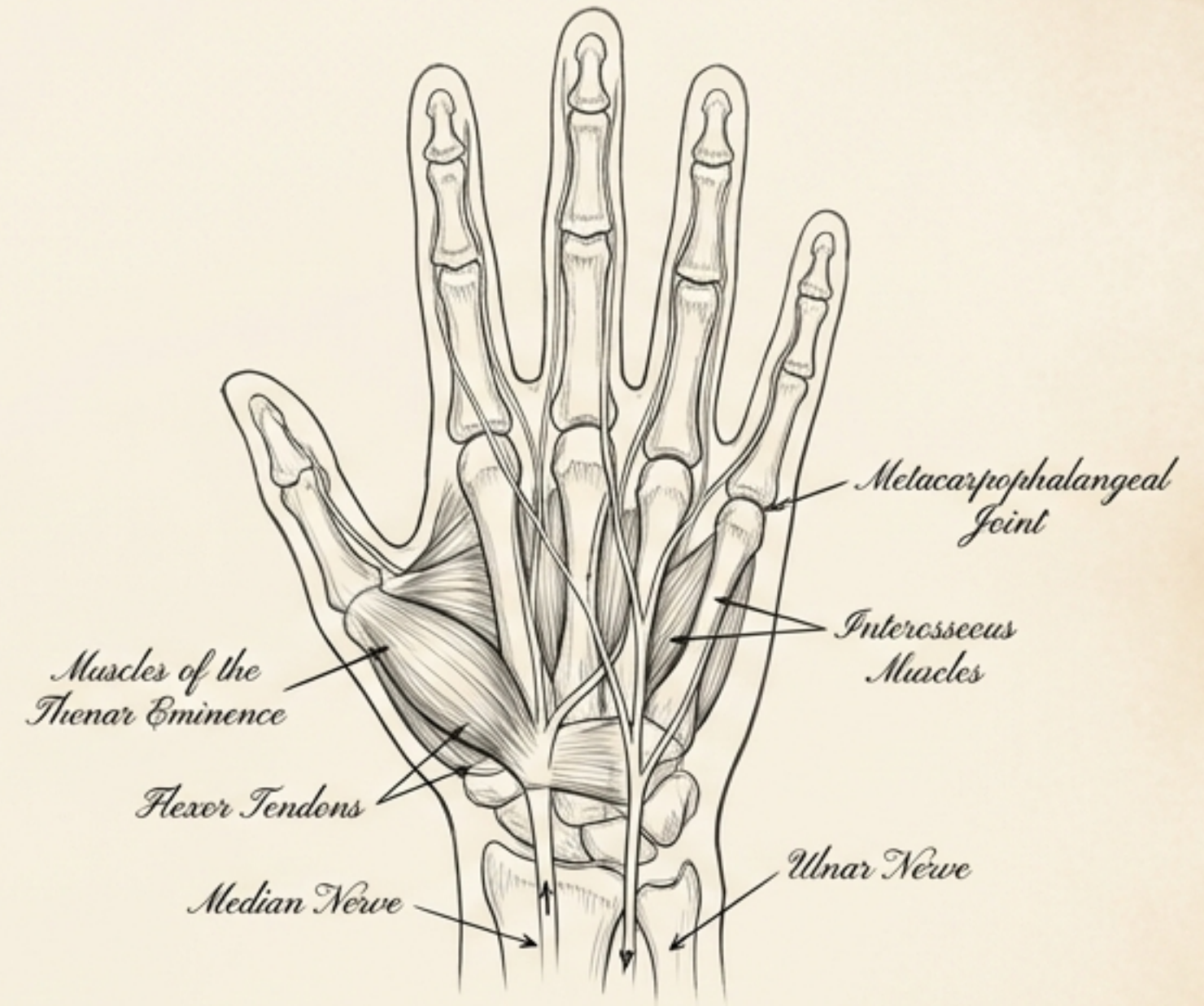


The Superstitious Fortune-Teller



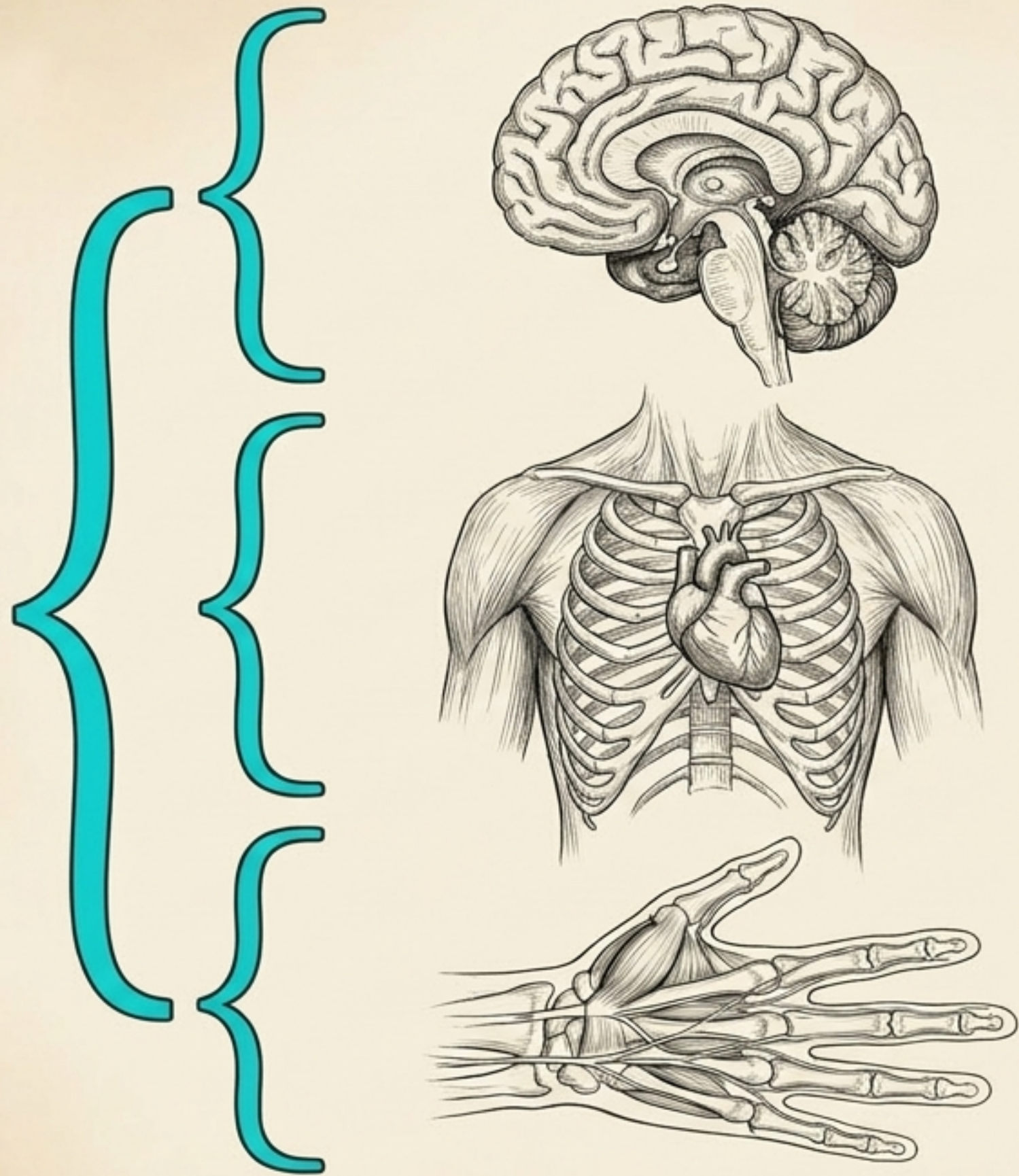

The Science of Physiology

Layer 1: The Divine / Moral

Located in the Brain (The 'Mens').
Represents Aspiration and supreme guidance.

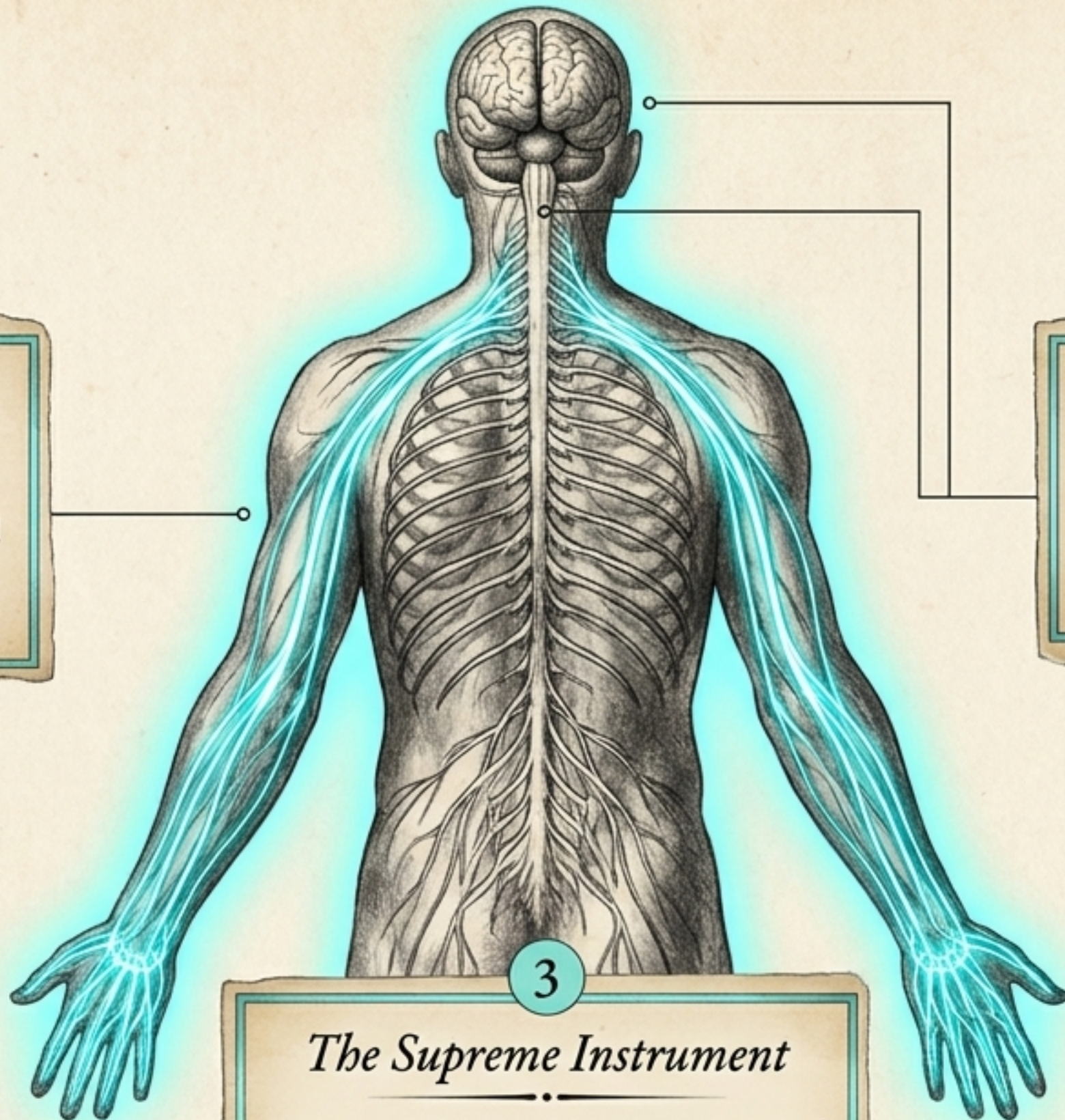
Layer 2: The Astral Body

The mysterious connecting link persistently searched for by scientists. Represents Action, bridging the gap between physical and mental life.

Layer 3: The Material Body

Located in the physical limbs/hands.
Represents Realization and raw instinct.

Adrien Adolphe Desbarrolles built his entire marvel of logical palmistry upon this Kabbalistic premise: every outward structure of the body is a manifestation of these three interacting realms.

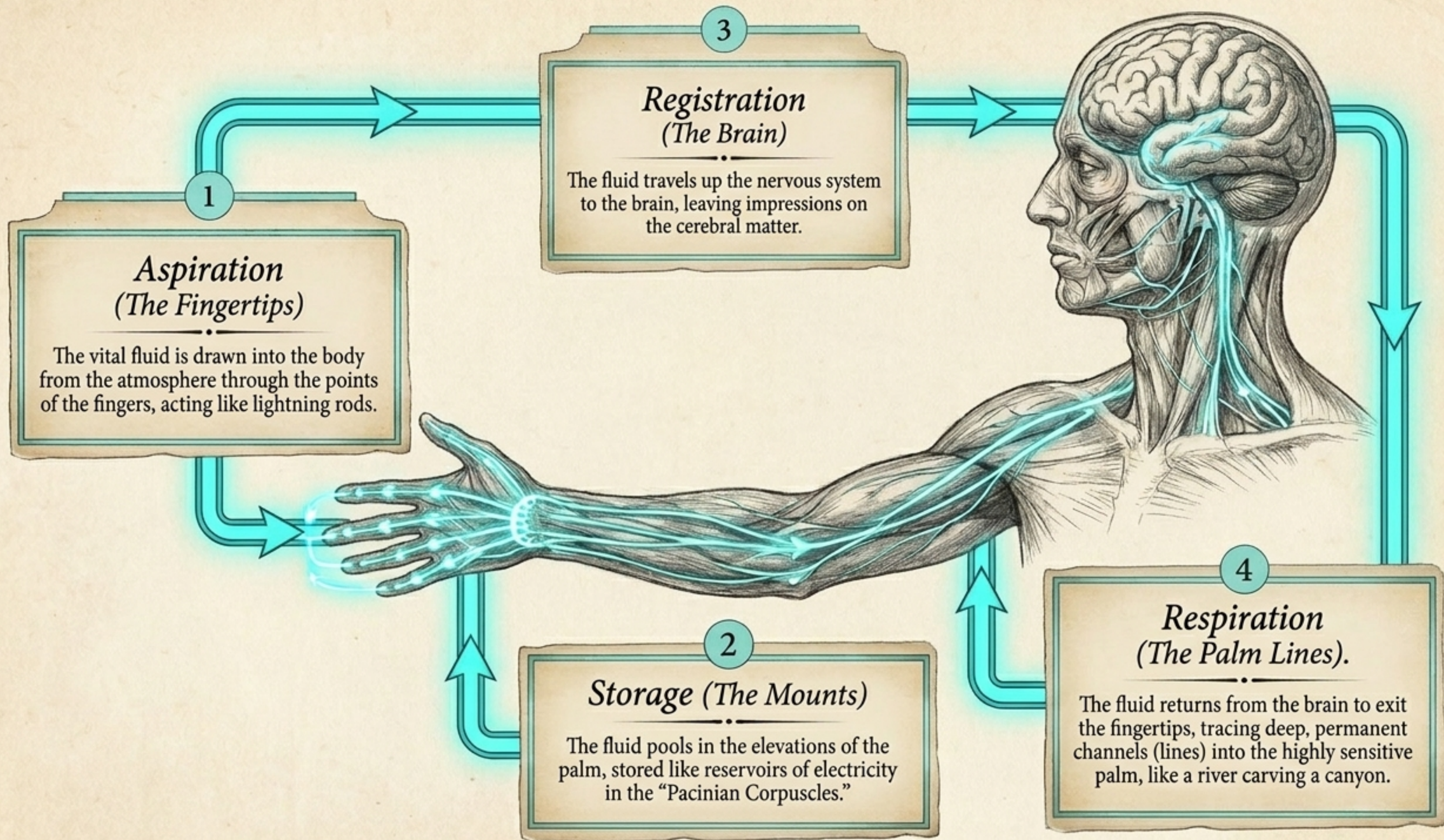
The Transmission

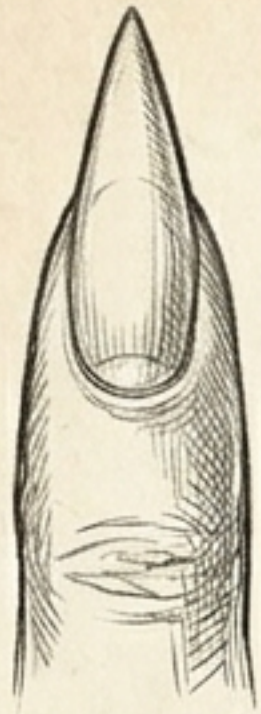
Ideas are not abstract; they are physical vibrations caused by external influence transmitted through the nerves to the cerebral fibers.

Aristotle called the hand "the organ of organs." It is the primary conduit where this magnetic electricity interfaces with the human brain.

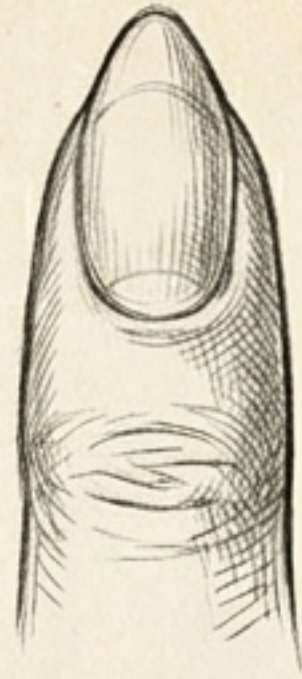




Pointed Tips

Mechanics: Attracts the vital fluid most freely, allowing life-producing action quicker and better.

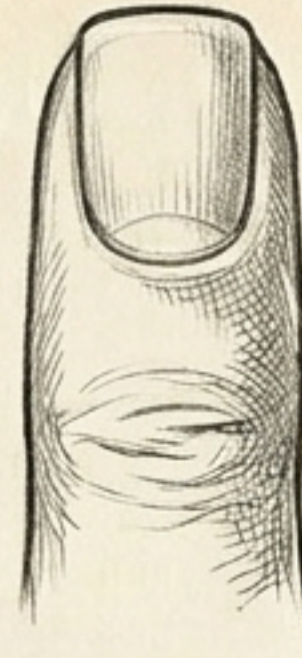
Result: Unusual inspiration, intuition, and poetic genius.



Conical Tips

Mechanics: Reduced facility for fluid penetration.

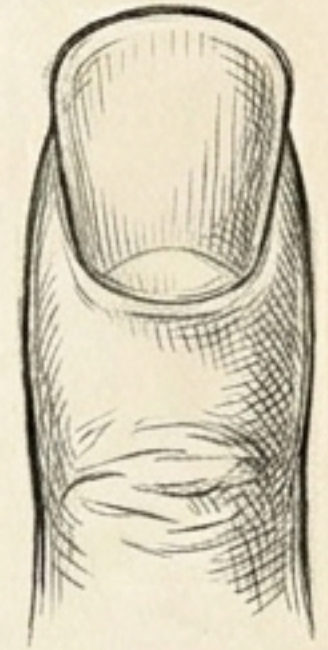
Result: Artistic tendencies, but less ideal and more grounded than the pointed tip.



Square Tips

Mechanics: Interferes with the even flow of fluid, placing the subject farther from the vital center.

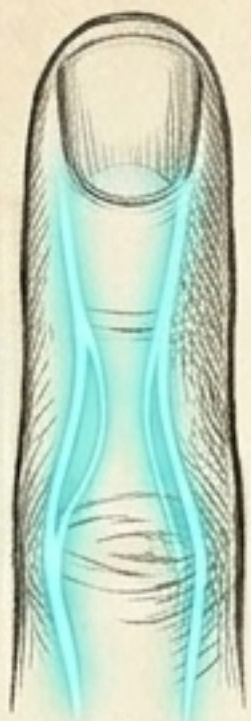
Result: The utilitarian hand; practical, logic-driven, uninfluenced by lofty impulses.



Spatulate Tips

Mechanics: Finds increased difficulties in penetrating the organism with pure fluid.

Result: Obeys material instincts, constant agitation, devoids of higher aspirations.



Smooth Fingers

Unimpeded Flow. The fluid rushes through without hitting barriers. Yields lightning-like intuition and unreasoned understanding.



Knotted Fingers

The Brakes. Knots oppose the running-in of the fluid, forcing reflection. Yields classifying instinct and deep reasoning power.



Short Hands

Small Surface Area. The fluid has so little space to run over that reflection barely has time to awaken.

Yields synthetic thinking; grasping ideas as a whole, not in details.

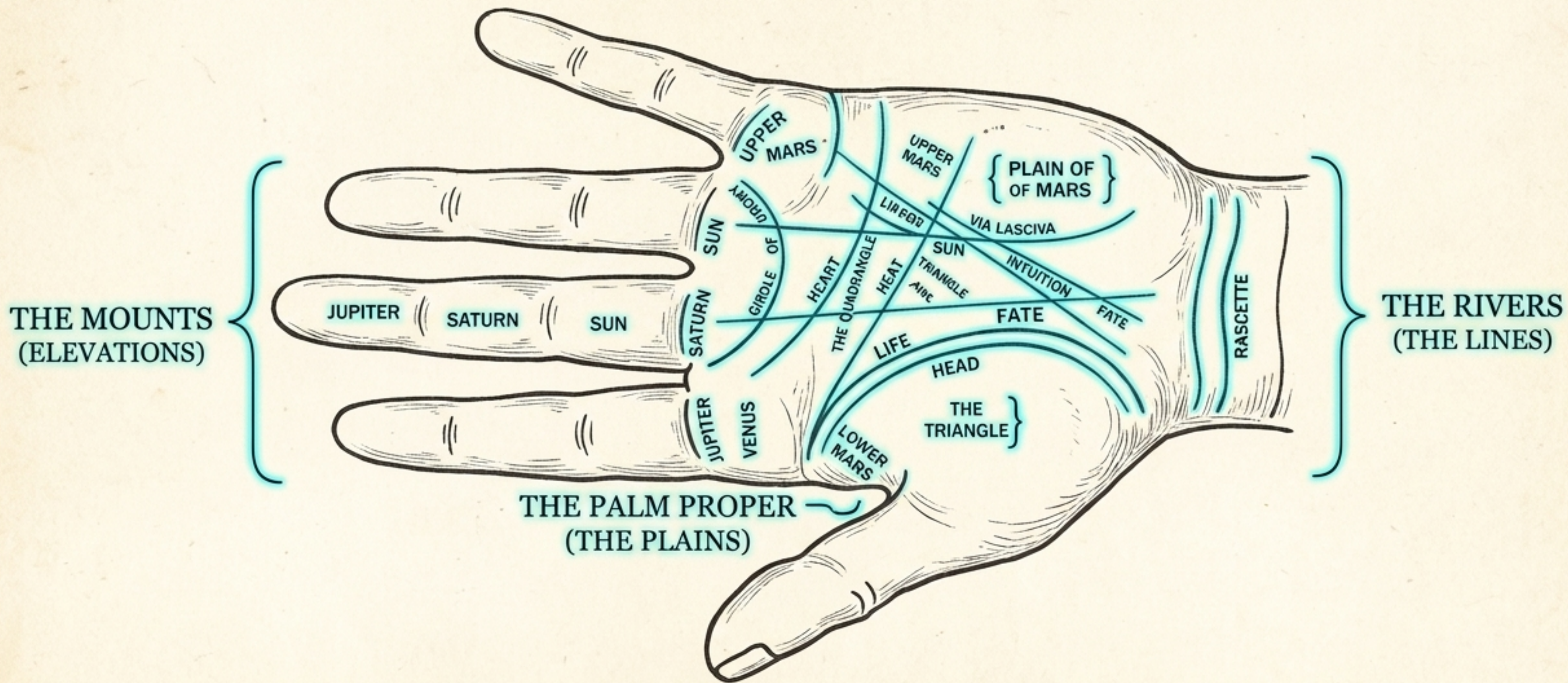


Long Hands

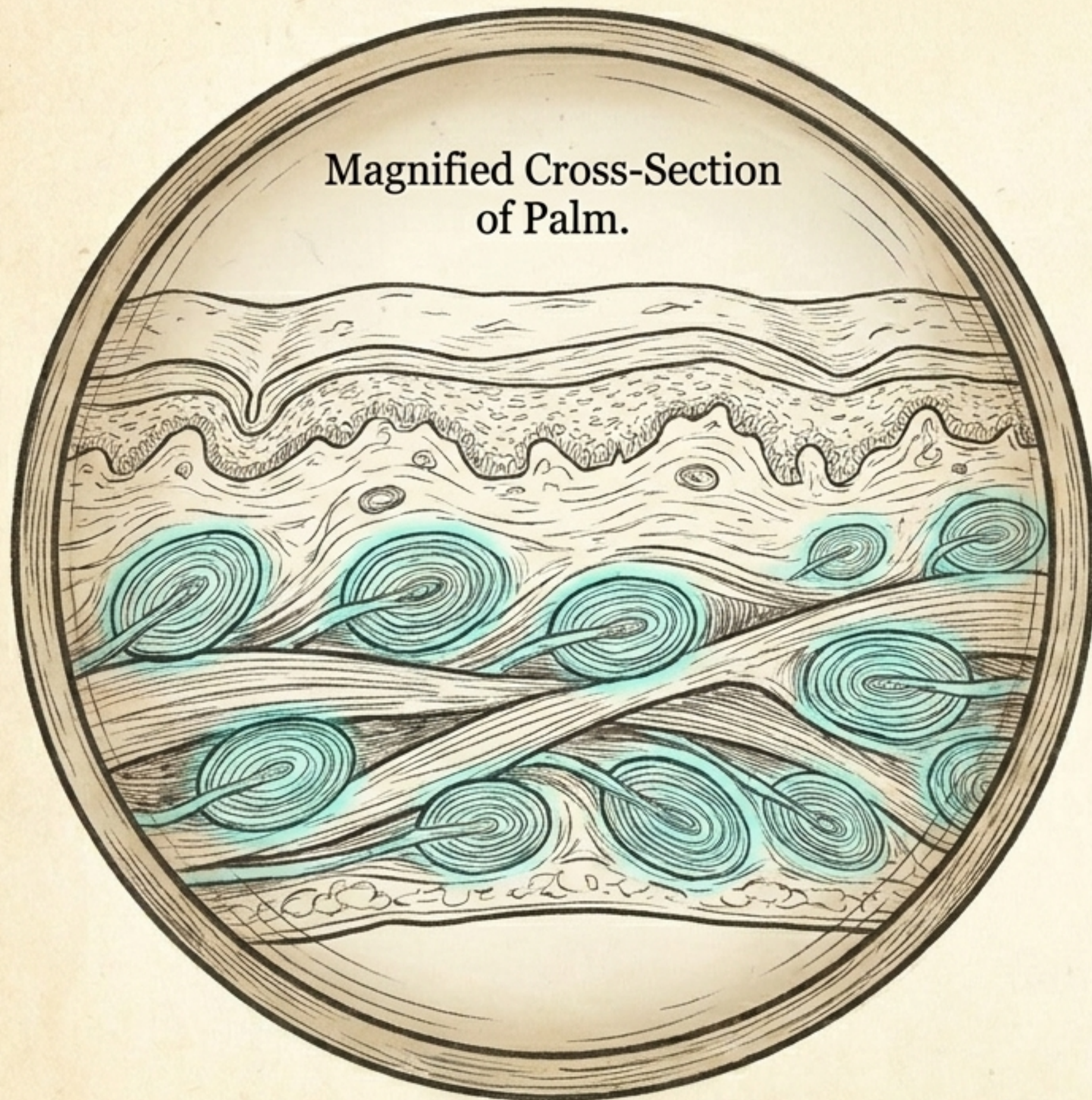
The Long Stretch. The distance covered by the fluid allows reflection to interfere and affirm itself.

Yields highly analytical, slow-to-decide tendencies.

MAP OF THE HAND



The hand is a geographical landscape. It does not contain mysteries; it contains Mounts (elevations), Rivers (lines), and Plains.

The Pacinian Corpuscles: Reservoirs of Instinct

The elevations at the base of the fingers (The Mounts) are not arbitrary. They are bundles of muscles containing agglomerations of nervous matter called Pacinian Corpuscles.

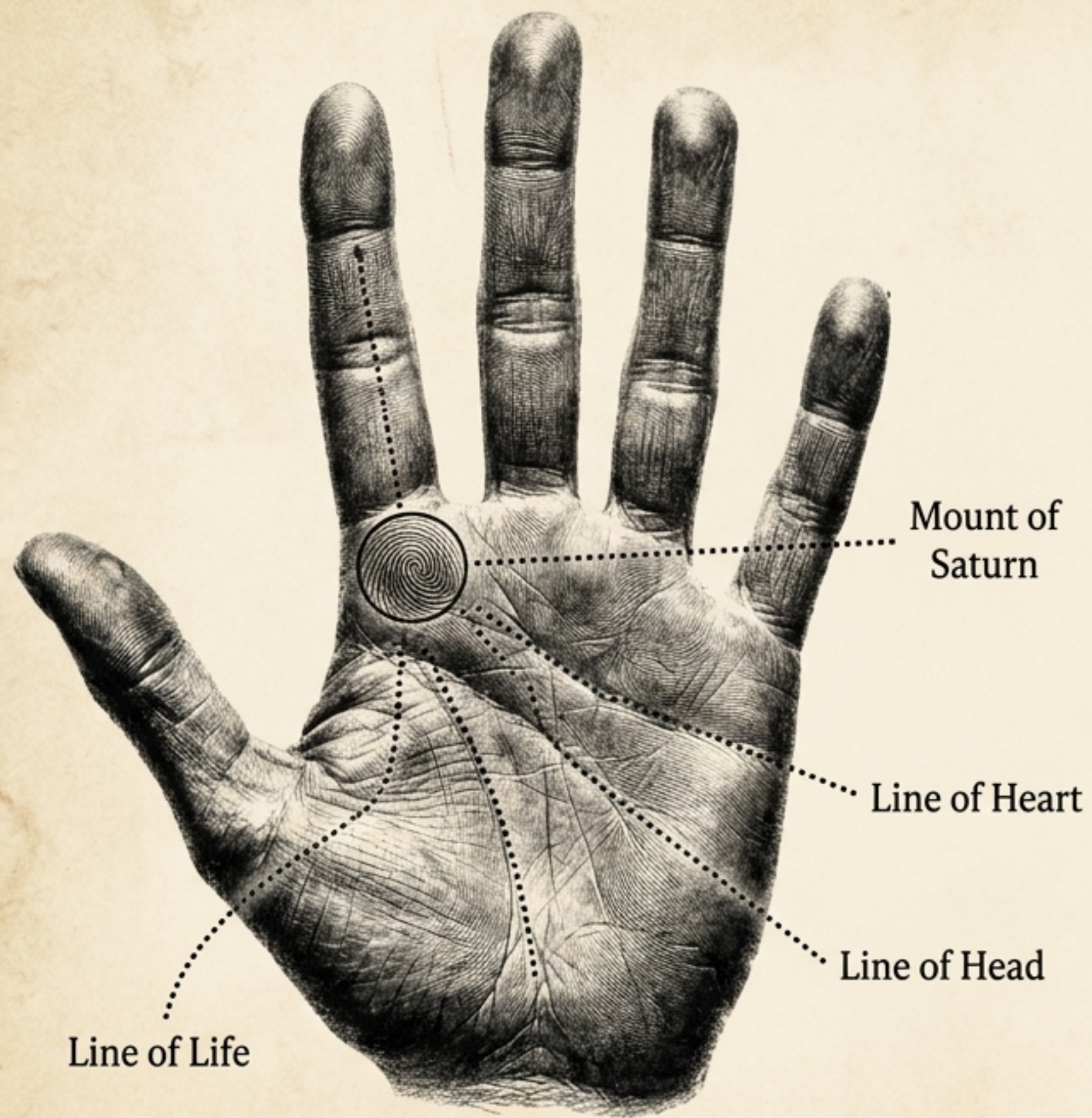
- There are 250 to 300 of these corpuscles in the elevations of the palm.
- They act as condensers of innervation, storing vital electricity.
- The Proof: Eminent scientists note the palm becomes burning hot in organic wasting diseases due to irritation in these instinctive centers. They are absent in the hands of the congenital idiot, and completely disappear in paralyzed hands.

Topological Shifts

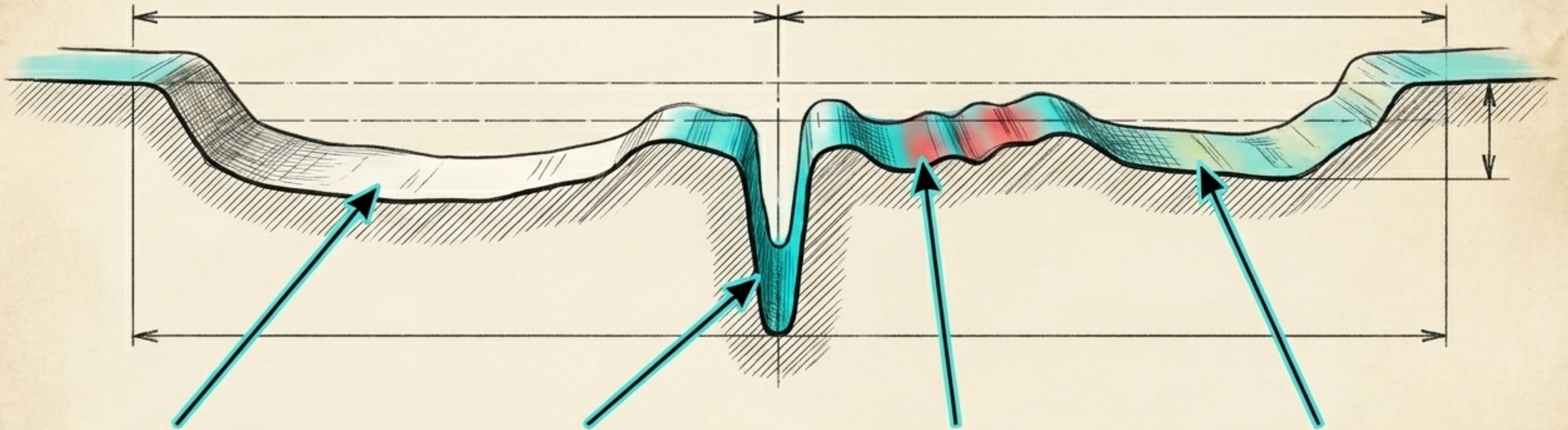
Concept: A Mount is only at its best when its apex (marked by the tiny lines of skin texture) is placed directly beneath its corresponding finger.

The Diagnostic Flow (Example: Jupiter):

- ☞ If leaning toward the first finger: Egotism, vanity.
- ♄ If leaning toward Mount of Saturn: Self-consciousness.
- ♥ If leaning toward Line of Heart: Pride in affection.
- If leaning toward Line of Head: Pride in intellect.
- ✓ If leaning toward Line of Life: Pride in family.

The Rivers of Destiny: Hydrography of the Hand.

Concept: The lines of the palm are deep channels traced by the vital fluid upon its return from the brain. The deeper the line, the more intense the nervous impression.



Pale and Broad Lines:
Indicate a wretched flow of vital fluid, resulting in a dull intellect or weak constitution.

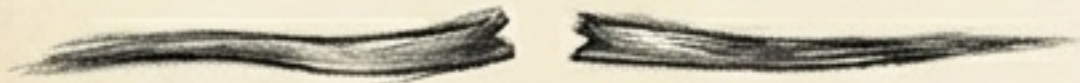
Very Deep Lines:
A sure indication of a serious strain on the nervous system.

Red Coloring:
A sign of great heat and violence in passions, an easily aroused anger, or a masterful spirit.

Yellow Color:
Indicates serious liver or digestive troubles.

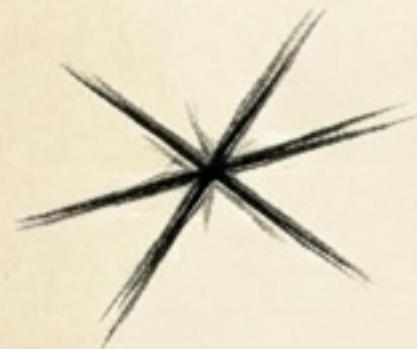
Line Malformations: Interruptions to the Flow

The Break



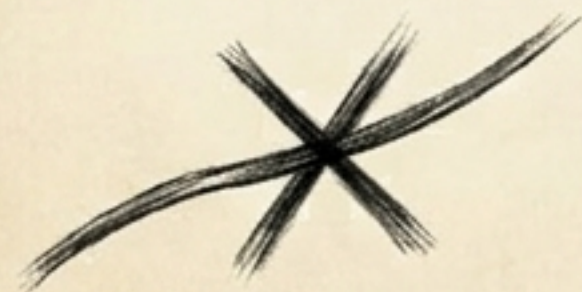
Indicates a severe interruption in the fluid's flow; successive reverses in business or incompetence due to poor health.

The Star



An explosion of vital fluid. Indicates fatal events, sudden illness, or extreme outcomes (e.g., a star on the Line of Liver = sterility).

The Cross



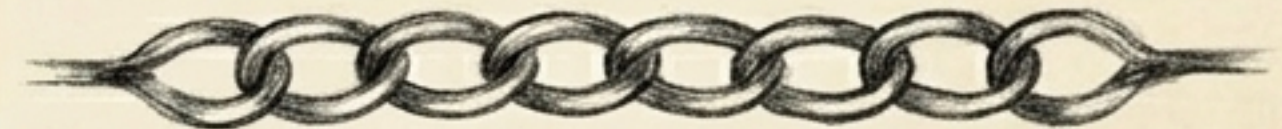
An over-excited imagination or a life full of difficulties.

The Island



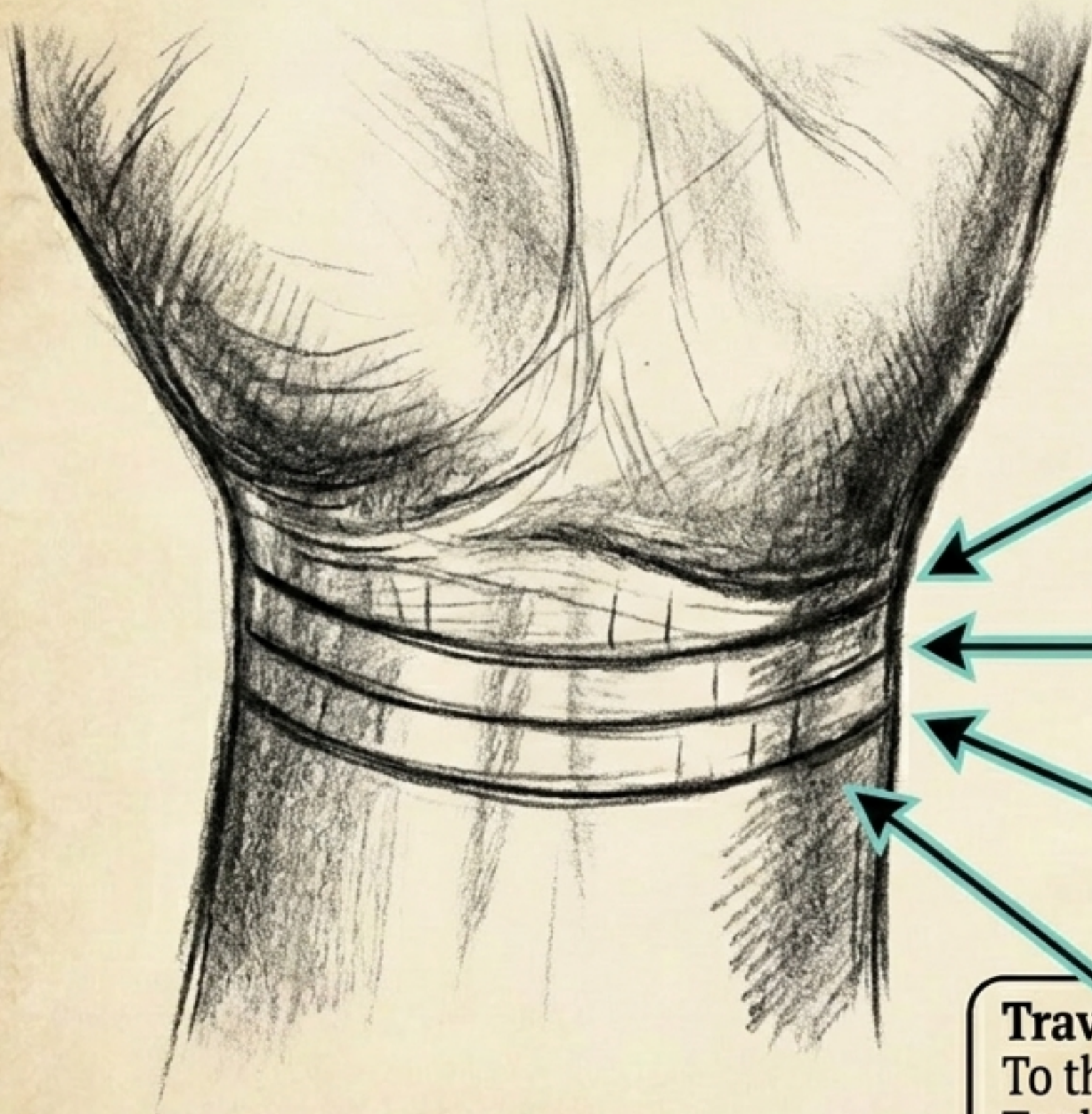
A splitting of energy. Often indicates a guilty intrigue affecting the brain, somnambulism, or hereditary illness (like consumption).

The Chain



Chronic instability. A chained Line of Head reveals a want of fixity in ideas and chronic headaches.

The Rascette (The Bracelets of Time)



The Rule of 28: Each clearly marked, unbroken bracelet promises roughly 23 to 28 years of life.

Diagnostic Branching:

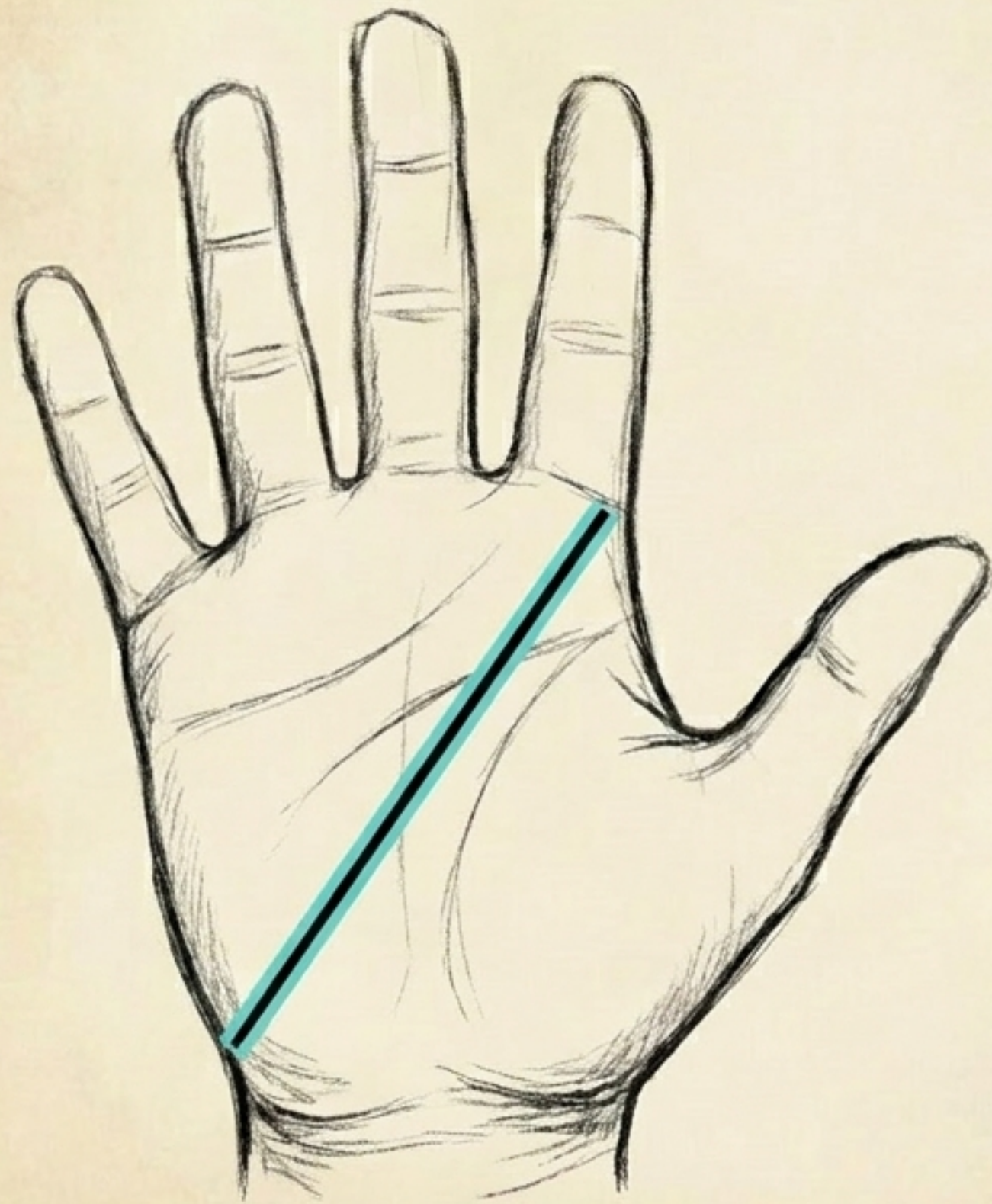
Three Clear, Colored Bracelets: Health, wealth, good fortune, and an easy existextending to 84 years.

First Bracelet Chained: A life of much hard work and care, but with final success crowning the efforts.

Poorly Formed Bracelets: A life of extravagance and dissipation.

Travel Lines: Minor lines rising from the Rascette indicate journeys.
To the Mount of Jupiter = A long successful journey.
To the Mount of the Moon = A sea voyage.

The Line of Liver (The Business River)



The Premise:

A perfect digestion and active liver contribute directly to clearness of thought and rapidity of action—the two essential qualities for a successful business career.

The Ideal State: Starting above the Rascette (not touching the Line of Life) and going straight to the Mount of Mercury signifies longevity, excellent digestive organs, and resulting success in business.

The Void: If the line is entirely absent, the subject has a quick mind and alert disposition. There is no biliousness, hence no heaviness caused by the poor working of the liver.

Line of Liver: Condition-to-Symptom Index

Branch 1: Thickness

Thick and Short → Impaired digestion in old age.

Thin and Straight → Stiffness of manner.

Branch 2: Color

Red throughout → Brutality and inordinate pride.

Thin and red in the middle → Tendency to bilious fevers.

Red where it crosses the Line of Heart → Apoplexy/Fits.

Branch 3: Texture

Wavy → Biliousness. If accompanied by a cold, **damp hand** → Poor success in business and dishonesty.

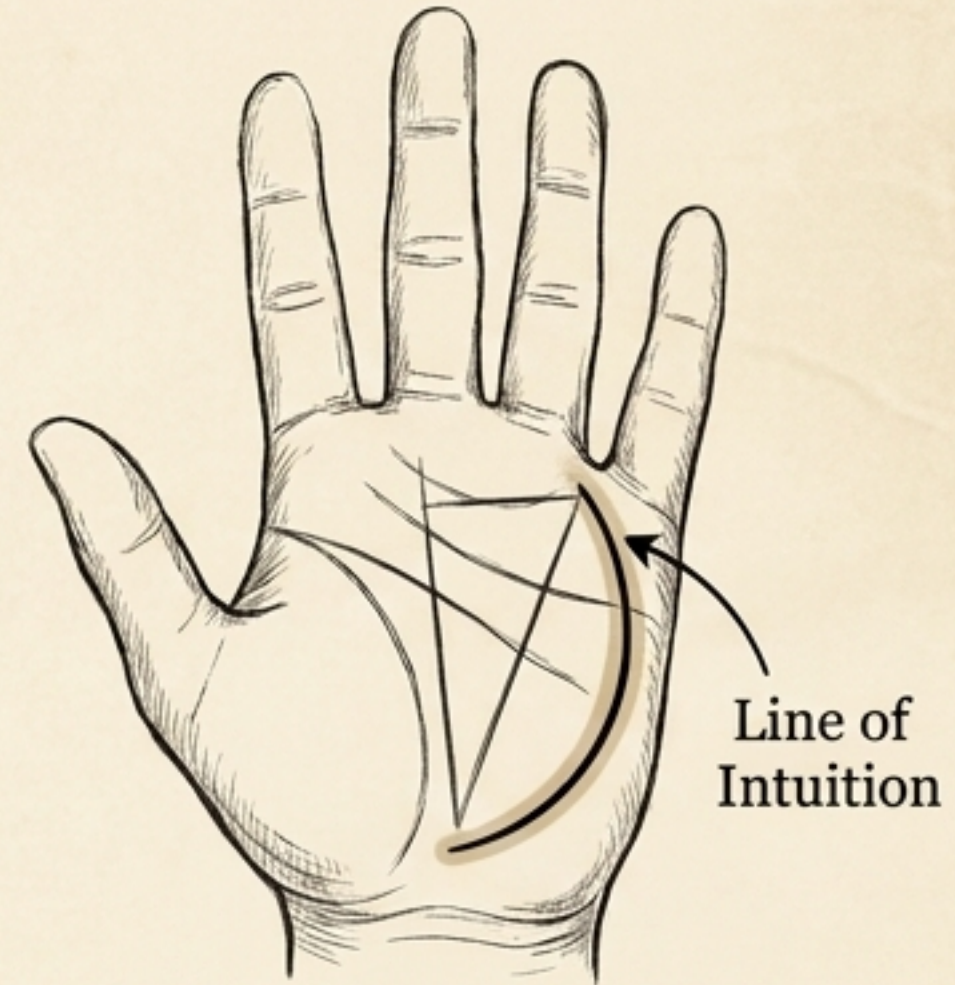
Deep and non-extending (trapped in Quadrangle) → Danger of brain fever.

The Via Lasciva (The Milky Way)



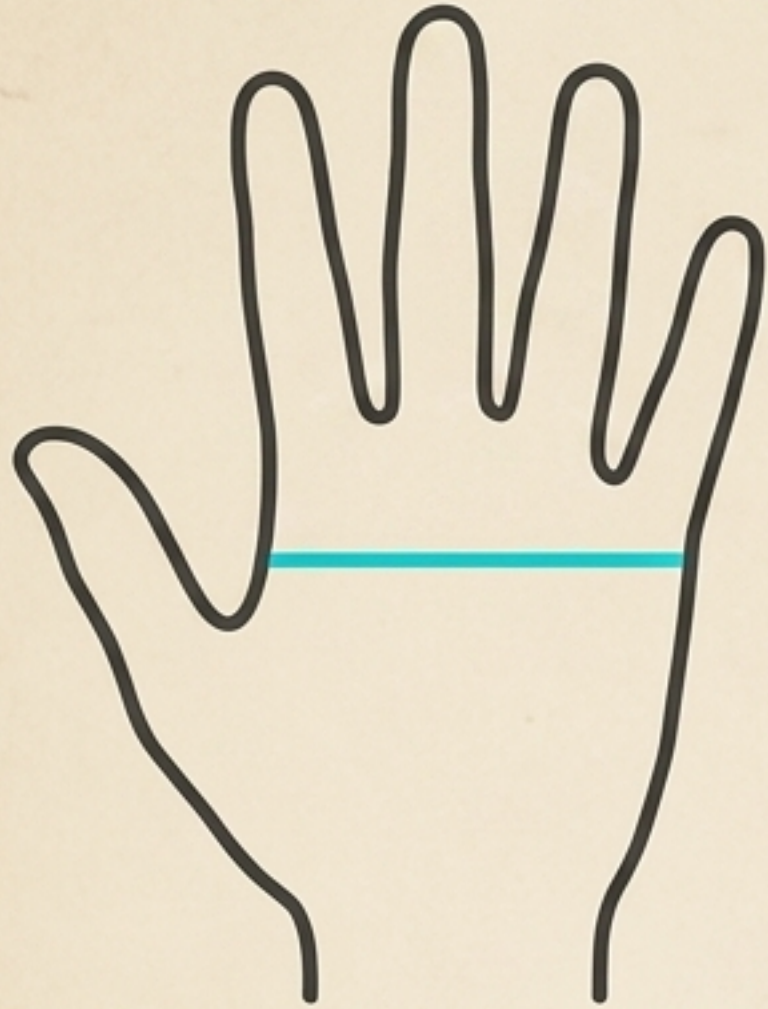
- When traced clearly in both hands, indicates sensuality and a passionate thirst for money.
- If wavy and long (starting inside Venus), indicates a life shortened by immorality and excesses.

The Line of Intuition



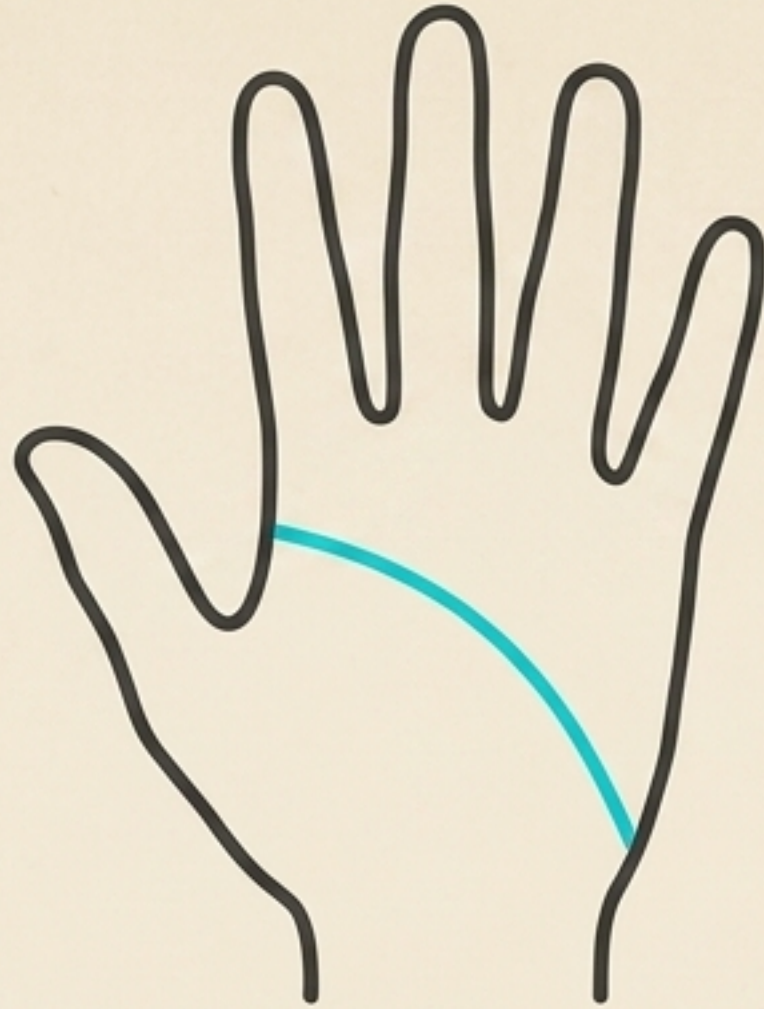
- Denotes an ultra-nervous disposition and the "Gift of Clairvoyance."
- When it forms a small triangle with the Line of Head and Fate, it confirms profound aptitude for the occult sciences.

The Line of Head (The Cerebral Pathway)



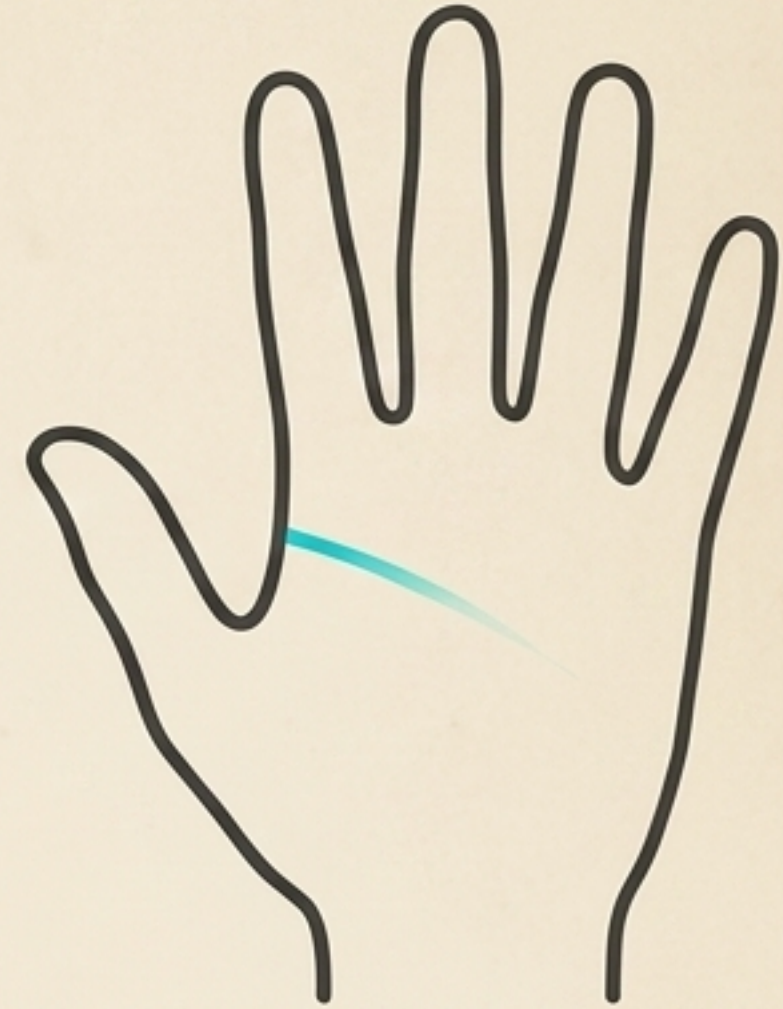
Variation 1: The Logical Mind

- Indicates love of details, a good memory, and an unyielding nature. If it stretches like a straight bar entirely across the palm, it reveals absolute avarice.



Variation 2: The Imaginative Mind

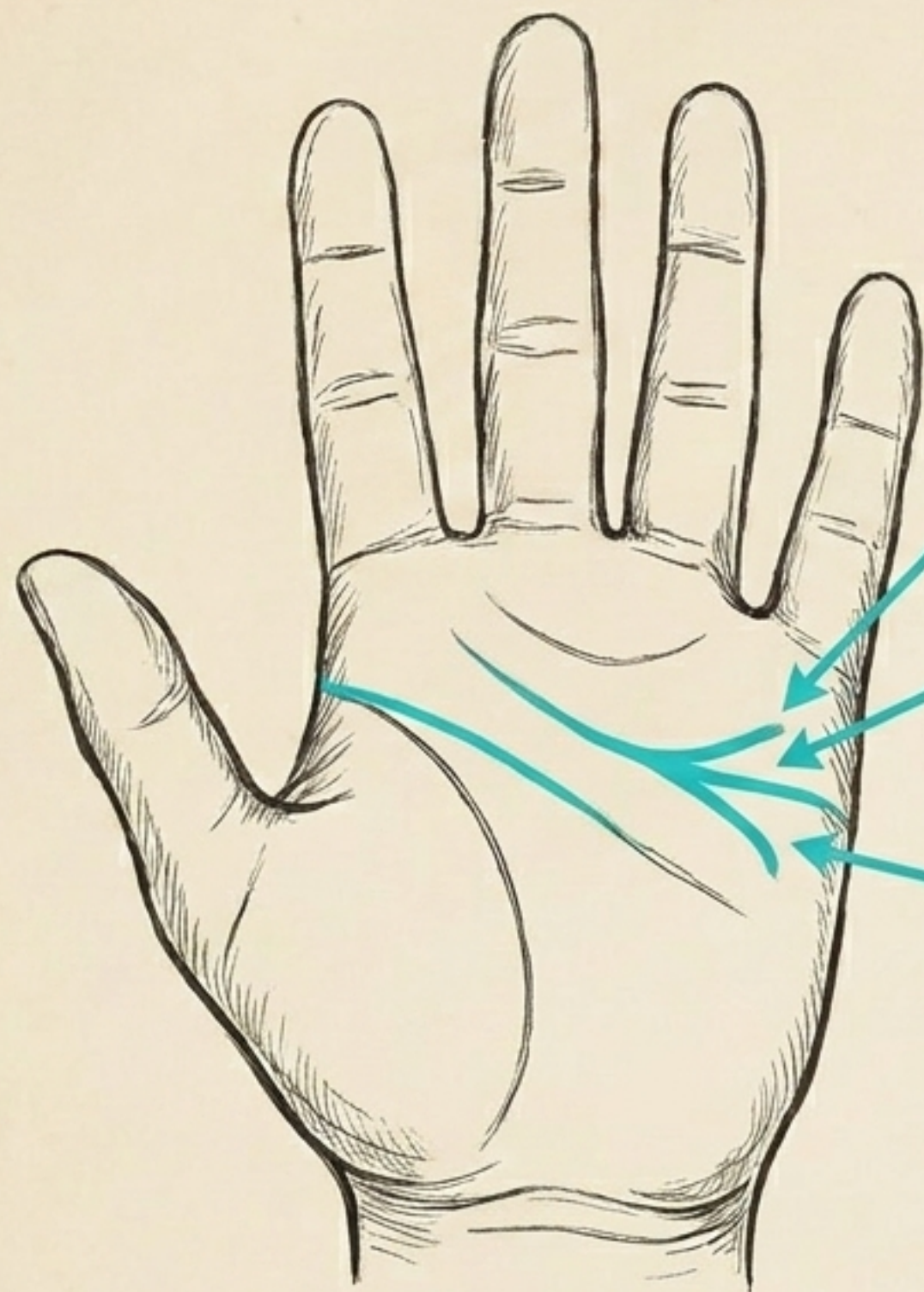
- The vital fluid is directed into the reservoir of imagination. Indicates a disposition to take great risks in business, love of gambling, or high poetic vision.



Variation 3: The Weakened Mind

- Frivolity, lack of brains, and no persistency of purpose. If paired with an exaggerated Mount of Venus, indicates utter laziness.

Forks of the Cerebral River



Endpoint A (Straight to the Percussion)

If the fork runs stiffly to the edge of the hand alongside a low Mount of Venus → Untrustworthiness and a lazy, voluptuary nature.

Endpoint B (Dipping into the Moon)

If one prong is normal and the other drops low into the Mount of the Moon → The subject will deceive himself first, and others afterward. In a genius, this is the power to make money out of one's talents.

Endpoint C (Rising to Mercury)

If one prong slopes to the Moon and the other rises to Mercury → The power to hypnotize, crafting a crafty disposition where the thirst for money blinds the subject to their means.

The Anatomy of a Reading: Synthesizing the Landscape.

Step 1: The Receptors (Fingers)

Establish the intake. Does the subject attract pure inspiration (Pointed) or material agitation (Spatulate)?

Step 2: The Capacitors (Mounts)

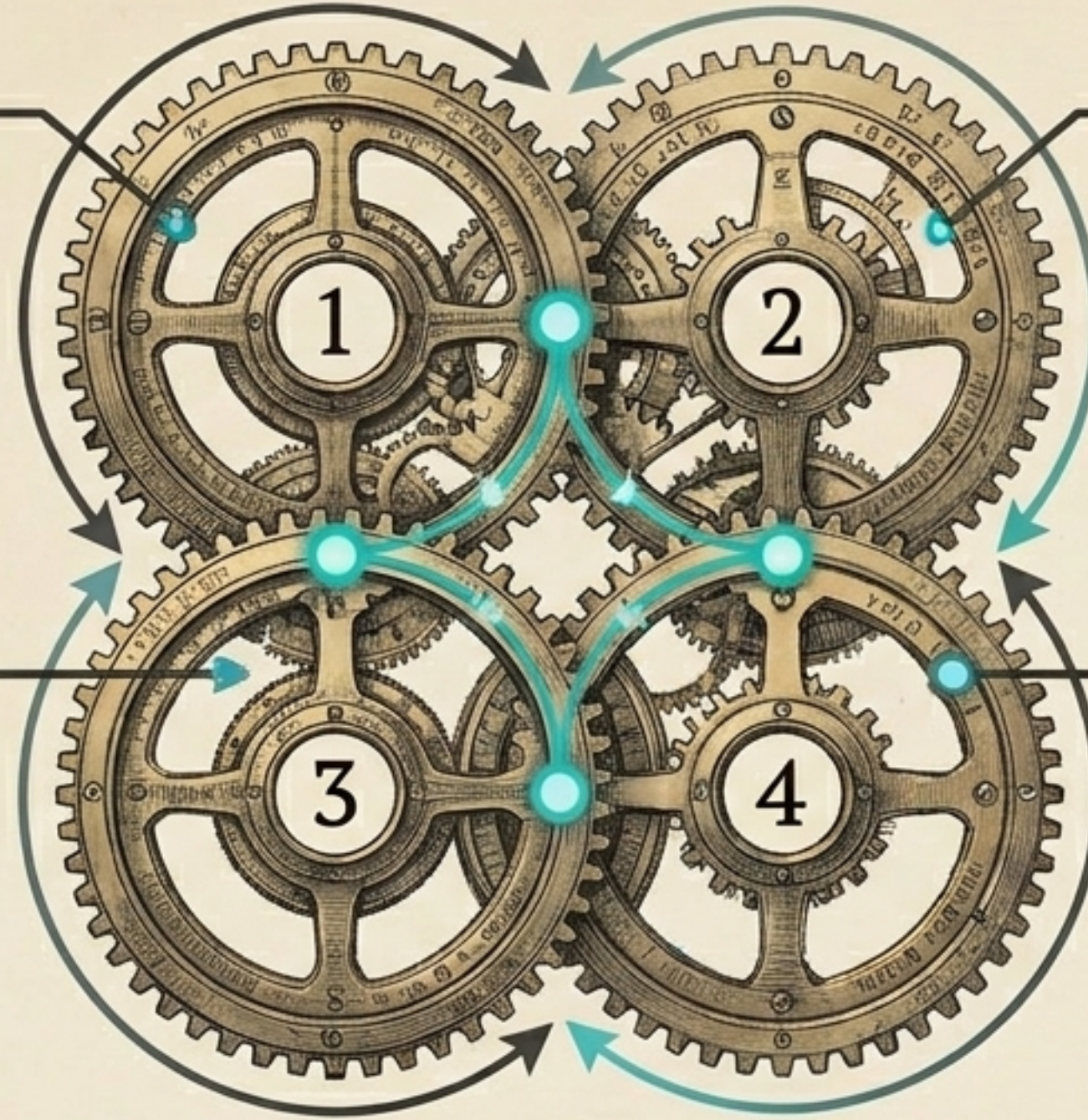
Evaluate the storage. Is the fluid pooling in the Mount of Jupiter (Ambition) or the Mount of the Moon (Imagination)? Is the apex displaced?

Step 3: The Conductors (Lines)

Trace the pathways. How efficiently is the fluid returning from the brain? Are the lines deep and red (violent passion), or pale and broad (dull intellect)?

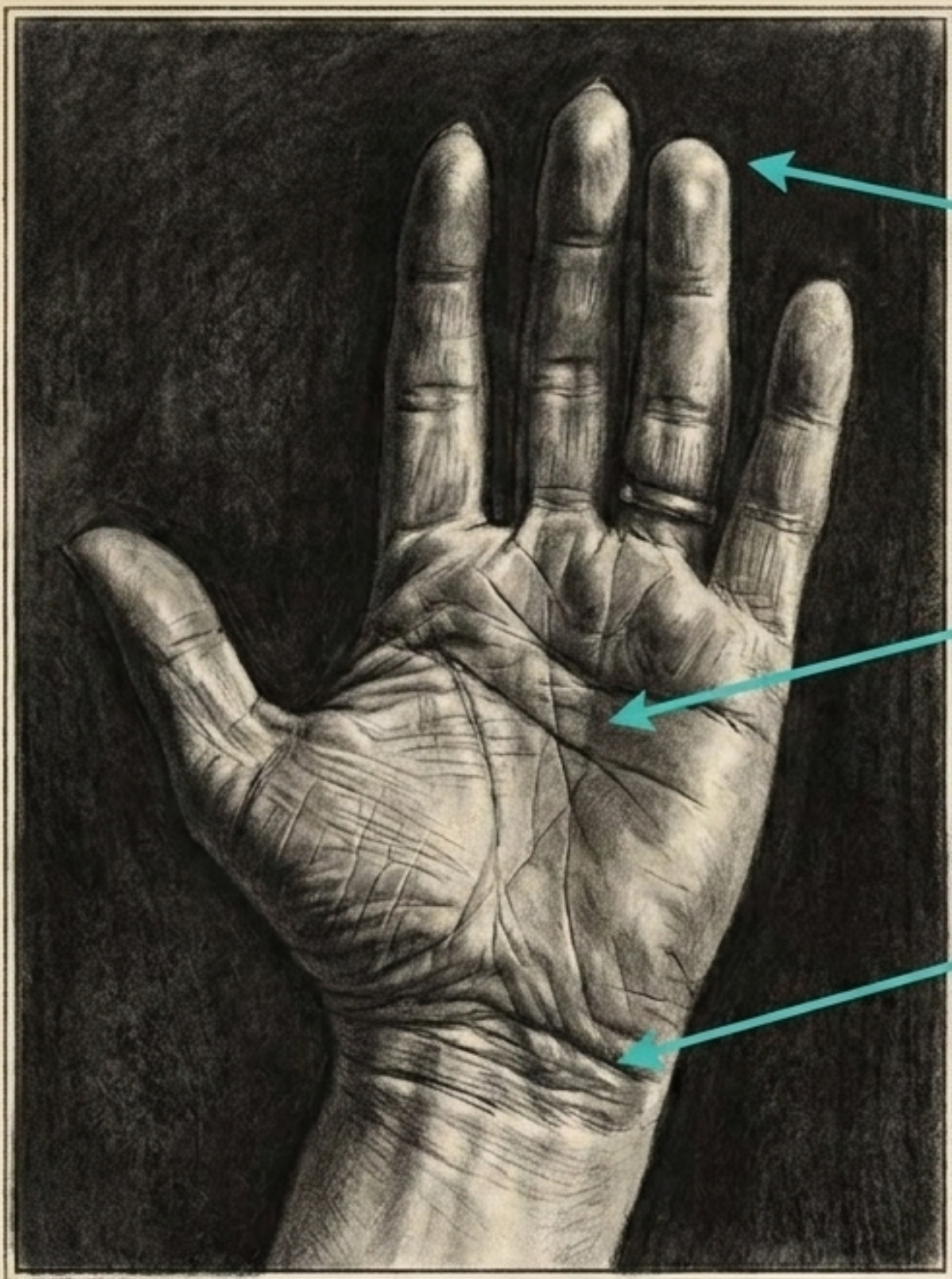
Step 4: The Interferences (Signs)

Spot the disruptions. Where do islands, stars, and breaks interrupt the flow, warning of impending systemic collapse or illness?



Core Insight: No single line dictates destiny. The hand is an integrated hydraulic system; a break in the Liver line is only fatal if the Head line cannot support the mental strain.

Specimen Zero: The Author's Hand.



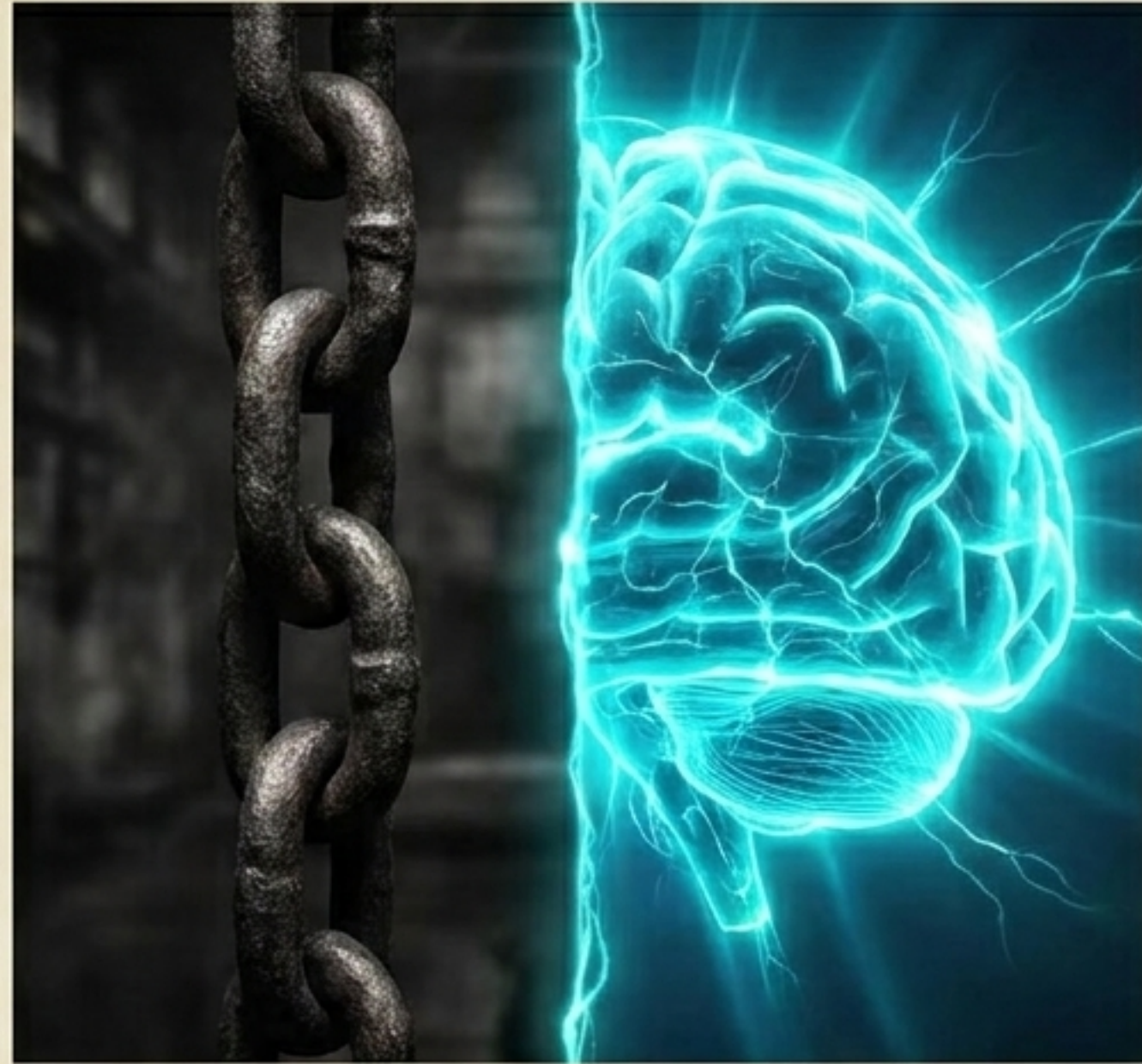
Pointed/Conical fingertips ->
High capacity for attracting vital fluid, granting the intuition necessary for the occult sciences.

Deep, clear Line of Head ->
Immense capacity for logical classification and mental endurance (as proven by writing a 2-volume, 1100-illustration manual).

A well-marked Rascette ->
Ensuring the longevity required to dedicate 29 years to chirosophic studies.
